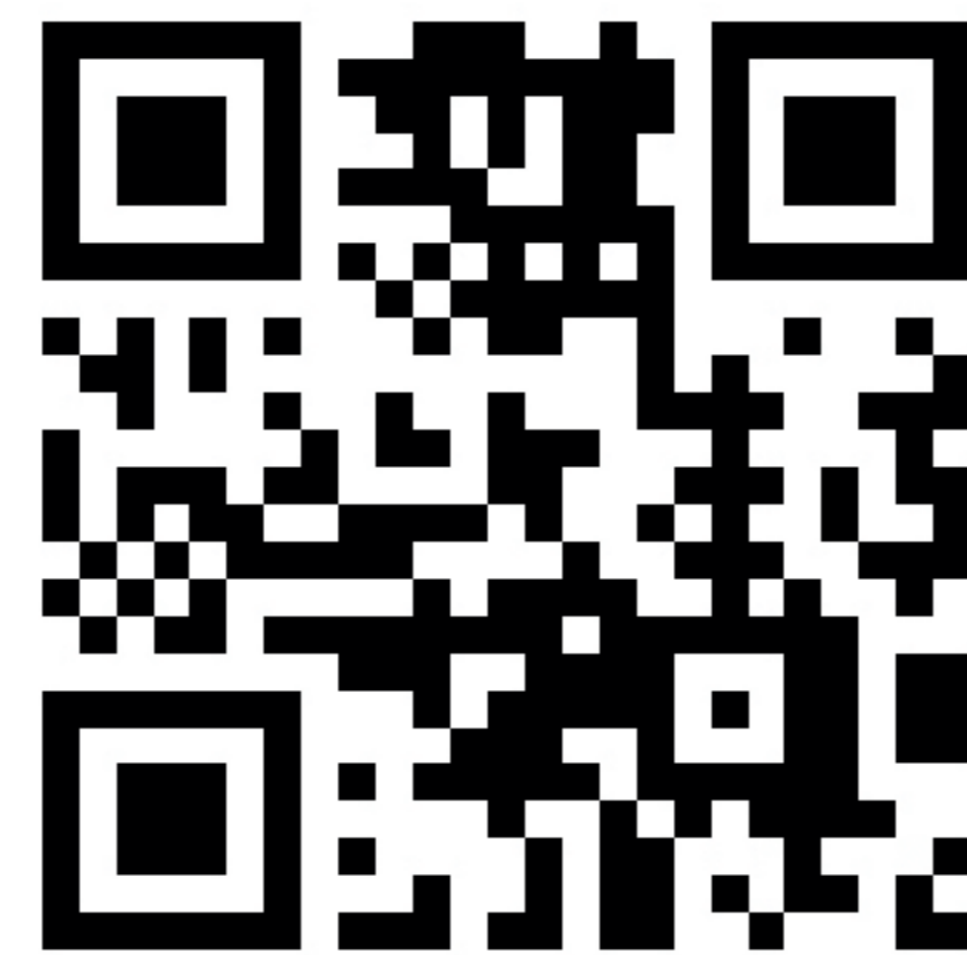

## CHILE SEISMIC COUNTRY



Chile is a seismic country located on the subduction boundary between the South American and Nazca Plates, where most local tsunamis are generated. Due to Chile's long history of earthquakes and tsunamis, everyone should be prepared for these events. If you experience an earthquake where it is difficult to stand or receive an official tsunami threat bulletin from the Local Chilean Maritime Authority, your vessel should prepare to set sail immediately, without a pilot and only with the assistance of a tugboat. Be aware of possible instructions from the Local Maritime Authority.

## WEATHER CONDITIONS



The marine climate Chile has its origin in processes of ocean-atmosphere interaction, with a great influence of the Subtropical Anticyclone of the South Pacific, which characterizes and models the climatology of a large part of the Chilean coast. This anticyclone seasonally moves from south to north and vice versa; in summer it positions its center on the Southern Coast, generating the natural blockage of the frontal systems. In winter, it positions its center on the Central Coast, which allows frontal systems to reach those latitudes and thus causing the rainy season from May to September.
